GOAL 1: Ballwin-Chesterfield fosters a growing diverse community of members, supporters, students and others who advance the AAUW mission.

General

- All branch meetings are publicized and open to the public.

Dollars for Scholars (DFS)

• Committee chairs and sponsors of DFS events will bring a total of six (6) guests or more to branch meetings or events in the course of the coming year. Dollars for Scholars will keep track of the number of guests in order to adjust this number for the following year.

Educational Opportunities Fund (EOF)

• EOF encourages all branch members to join and attend committee meetings and functions.

Hospitality

- Hospitality provides refreshments to all members and guests at each monthly meeting.
- Hospitality provides a framework/umbrella within which AAUW'S goals can be maintained and strengthened.

Legal Advocacy Fund (LAF)

- All LAF meetings are open meetings.
- Communication about LAF is maintained through the branch newsletter and presentations at branch meetings.
- Guest speakers reinforce the activities of LAF.

Newsletter

• The newsletter publishes all branch meetings via electronic distribution, postal mailing to members without email, the AAUW website, and Facebook.

Special Events – Fall Brunch

• The Fall Brunch Committee publicizes the event and opens it to all members and guests at no cost to any person attending.

GOAL 2: Under auspices of AAUW'S powerful advocacy programs, Ballwin-Chesterfield works locally to promote educational and economic equity and civil rights for all women and girls.

General

- Ballwin-Chesterfield collaborates with other local organizations that advocate for women and girls.
- Ballwin-Chesterfield develops activities that promote AAUW's Public Policy Program.
- Ballwin-Chesterfield Legal Advocacy Fund committee educates members on civil rights issues affecting women and girls and develops fundraisers to support AAUW LAF programs.

Educational Opportunities Fund (EOF)

• EOF works with colleges, offering local scholarships and funds to nontraditional women who are completing undergraduate degrees.

Legal Advocacy Fund (LAF)

• Through an efficient communication system, members are provided appropriate information regarding equity and rights.

Newsletter

• Through monthly articles, the newsletter educates members about public policy and LAF issues and activities.

Programs

• Through careful exploration and vetting of topics and speakers, the Programs Committee works to ensure that the program at each Branch meeting is mission based and provides opportunity for educational growth.

Public Policy

- Preventing Human Trafficking in St. Charles County: Ballwin-Chesterfield is implementing the second year of the Community Action Grant. Communications/Web

• Communications/Web educates members about the AAUW Fund through the branch, state and national websites.

Dollars for Scholars (DFS)

- DFS will increase the amount of funds available for scholarships that our branch is able to fund by increasing the number of events throughout the year by 20% over last year.
- DFS will work to maximize the number of participants in several ways:
 - By keeping the Dollars for Scholars website updated;
 - By "talking up" events at board and branch meetings;
 - By passing out the DFS handout of events before each branch meeting.

STEM

- STEM encourages local girls and women to pursue careers in STEM in the following ways:
 - By recognizing success at Science Fair;
 - By recognizing high school women through STEM Girls of Promise;
 - By sponsoring middle school girls to attend the Expanding Your Horizons conference.
