2018 AAUW MO Awards

At the AAUW MO annual meeting the weekend of May 5, the AAUW Ballwin-Chesterfield (MO) Branch was recognized in the following categories:

Top branch in Missouri in Total Giving

- Sixth in Missouri in Per Capita Giving
- Galaxy and 10-Star Awards

The 10-Star Award is given to branches who fulfilled their goals in leadership, programs, membership, visibility, education, funds giving goals, public policy, international affairs, technology, and social justice. Branches may receive up to 10 stars; B-C has received all 10 stars annually.

The Galaxy Award is the highest level of the AAUW Missouri Star Program and recognizes a branch mission-based project. B-C received the Galaxy Award for its Munching Matters Interest Group lunches, whose focus is topics relating to the AAUW mission. This series features B-C members who tell stories about their lives. Shape the Future allows local branches to offer half-off national dues for the first year when someone joins at a public event. Our branch began offering this benefit last year. Keep these in mind when you're talking to prospective new members.

Legal Advocacy Fund

Many members have heard Aileen Rizo speak and have been following her case for equal pay. Here is the latest information from *The LAF Express*: On April 9, 2018, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit reversed a decision from a smaller panel last year in *Rizo v. Fresno County Office of Education*, holding that prior salary alone as a "factor other than sex" or in combination with other factors cannot justify a pay differential. This case matters because basing pay on salary history can perpetuate the gender pay gap due to women typically being paid less in prior jobs than men, in direct contrast with the intent of the *Equal Pay Act (EPA)* of 1963.

This decision is a huge victory for employees within the jurisdiction of the Ninth Circuit. However, the fight for protections for all workers continues. Federal legislation like the *Paycheck Fairness Act*, currently pending in Congress, would ban the use of salary history nationwide and provide much-needed updates to strengthen the EPA. AAUW will continue to support Rizo through our legal case support program as her case moves through any further appeal.
