GOAL 2: Under auspices of AAUW'S powerful advocacy programs, Ballwin-Chesterfield works locally to promote educational and economic equity and civil rights for all women and girls.

General

- Ballwin-Chesterfield collaborates with other local organizations that advocate for women and girls.
- Ballwin-Chesterfield develops activities that promote AAUW's Public Policy Program.

AAUW Fund

 Through an efficient communication system, members are provided appropriate information regarding equity and rights.

Newsletter

 Through monthly articles, the newsletter educates members about public policy and other issues and activities.

Program

• Through careful exploration and vetting of topics and speakers, the program committee works to ensure that the program presented at each branch meeting is mission-priority related and provides opportunity for educational growth. AAUW priorities are Educational Equity, Health & Economic Well-Being, Diversity/Gender Equity, Social Justice, Public Policy/Legislative Issues, Human Rights, and International Relations. AAUW recommends programming in the following areas: civil rights, affirmative action, hate crimes prevention, reproductive rights, economic security, work-life balance, pay equity, retirement security, health care, K-12 education, career and technical education, charter schools, higher education, school vouchers, STEM, Title IX, ending sexual harassment.

Public Policy

- Focus on Economic Security and Pay Equity: Ballwin Chesterfield members will be informed about the issues and life-long consequences of the gender pay gap, will be instructed on the on-line WorkSmart course and encouraged to become facilitators of WorkSmart. (salary.aauw.org)
- Get Out the Vote: Ballwin-Chesterfield members will participate in various activities including voter registration, training through Advancement Project regarding voter protection, working the pols, and writing post cards to registered voters encouraging their participation in voting. - Preventing Sexual Harassment and Sexual Violence in Schools: will continue
 to focus on the two-thirds of schools reporting zero allegations of sexual
 harassment or bullying. Ballwin-Chesterfield Public Policy keeps members
 informed through newsletter articles and branch meeting announcements
 and encourages members to contact legislators regarding these issues at
 local, state, and national levels.
- Preventing Human Trafficking in St. Charles County: Ballwin-Chesterfield Public Policy keeps members informed, through newsletter articles, branch meeting announcements and AAUW Quick Facts.
- Passing a Gender Pay Gap Bill and Title IX in Missouri: In implementing the AAUW Missouri Impact Grant, Public Policy will contact legislators and work with the Missouri Lobby Corps to focus on the passage of the pay equity bill. Reference: AAUW Quick Facts (www .advocacy@aauw.org).
