Notes from the Finance Officer

2020–21 Proposed Budget

The 2020–21 proposed budget was approved by the board in September. The next step is for members to approve the plan at the October branch meeting. A copy of the proposed budget will be emailed to each member before the branch meeting to review. Ballwin-Chesterfield Bank Accounts

The Operating Fund Account is the biggest and most active account and is funded in two ways. First, B-C retains the \$22 branch dues portion of the \$91 paid to AAUW national, and second, by the winter fundraiser. Operating Fund expenses mainly include rental and coffee for the board and branch meetings at Trinity, speaker costs, liability and director and officer insurance policies, an AAUW Fund donation, International Relations, IBC and NCCWSL support, STEM activities, AAUW state and regional convention attendance, and officer, director and committee expenses. Check the Operating Fund section of the budget to see all the other wonderful things we support.

The Dollars for Scholars Account is funded by the Dollars for Scholars outings that our members plan. During COVID-19 restrictions, members can make a personal donation to DFS to fund scholarships. This is not tax-deductible. The account contributes towards tuition for four women returning to college.

Schnucks/Contingency Account (new name) receives direct deposits from your store purchases. There are no expenses. Since Schnucks has changed their reward program to require a choice between a personal reward or an organizational donation, branch rewards have been reduced considerably. If you would like to support Ballwin-Chesterfield, please present your Schnucks card to the cashier at the beginning of the transaction. If you want to use your rewards for your personal account, you must enter your phone number. You cannot do both things during each purchase. You must make a choice. Ballwin-Chesterfield sincerely appreciates the members who choose to continue to designate rewards to our branch.

B-C PayPal Account Established

Members will now have a choice about how to send money to Ballwin-Chesterfield. You can always send a check for events or donations. Now you can also send payment through PayPal.

Please remember that money sent by PayPal to B-C is charged a fee of 2.9 percent plus \$.30 for each transaction. For example, if you send \$1, the branch receives \$.67 and PayPal keeps \$.33. There is no charge to you. The fee is deducted from your payment to B-C and the remaining amount is deposited into our B-C PayPal account. So, if you intend to send \$1 to B-C, you need to actually send \$1.33.

Research Update

Did you know that on average women in America are paid only 82 cents for every dollar paid to men? At this rate, the pay gap will not close until 2093. Women are not drawn to low-paying fields because they want less money; rather, the work that women do is simply valued less than work done by men. The undervaluing of women's work, bias against working mothers, race and gender bias, and lack of salary transparency all diminish women's earnings. This long-term effect on a woman's retirement and pension benefits increases over time. What can we do? In AAUW's research article, *The Simple Truth About the Gender Pay Gap/Fall 2019 Update*, seven ways are listed to close the gender pay gap. AAUW research serves as a catalyst for action, and is based on facts not fiction. Visit <u>www.aauw.org</u> to learn more about the current research.

AAUW is committed to the campaign of Every Voice, Every Vote. We can only be successful if every citizen can exercise the right to vote. The B-C Public Policy committee will be supporting activities to get out the vote for the next two months. The areas of focus will be to provide members with information about absentee and mail-in voting, to direct them to key sources of information and to inform about Amendment 3 and advocacy opportunities.

Absentee versus Mail-in Voting

Absentee	Mail-In
Step 1: Complete application for absentee ballot, return in person or by mail, email or fax.	Step 1: Complete application for mail-in ballot, return in person or by mail.
Step 2: Complete received ballot and have return envelope notarized, if needed.	Step 2: Complete received ballot and have the envelope notarized.
Step 3: Return ballot to local election authority, by mail or in person.	Step 3: Return mail-in ballot through U.S. mail only.

Exception to Notary Requirement

You are eligible to vote absentee without a notary for the November 2020 election if your reason is because of:

- Incapacity or confinement due to illness
- In 2020, has contracted coronavirus or is at-risk due to any of the following:
 - \circ Is age 65 or older
 - o Lives in a long-term care facility
 - o Has chronic lung disease/asthma
 - Has a serious heart condition
 - \circ Is immunocompromised
 - Has diabetes
 - o Has chronic kidney disease and is undergoing dialysis
 - $\circ \quad \text{Has liver disease} \\$

- Select current books (publishing date no more than 3 years ago is optimum) or hardback and oversized paperbacks to garner the most money.
- Do not donate textbooks. No matter how much you learned from them, Half Price Books does not pay for them.
