STEM Updates Potential COVID-19 Treatment Discovered by a High School Student?

As we all anxiously await a cure and an end to this pandemic, a 14-year-old, Anika Chebrolu, has been working on a potential treatment. She recently won the 3M Young Scientist challenge and \$25,000 for her discovery.

She developed a potential antiviral for COVID-19 infection by finding a molecule from a database of millions of compounds that can bind to the spike protein of the SARS-CoV-2 virus and change its shape. By changing the shape of the spike protein when the molecule attaches, it can stop the virus from infecting human cells. This basically stops the infectivity of the virus in human cells.

During a recent interview, Anika mentioned that there are a lot of girls in the world who do not get the same support as she does from her family to pursue their STEM passions. She encouraged other girls who want to go into STEM, to just know that they are no different and to take any opportunity that they can.
