From the Finance Officer

2021–22 dues increased by \$3

As you recall, the AAUW Board of Directors voted, in October, to increase the individual member dues for the next three years. So, dues for 2021–22 are \$62 for national (previous \$59 plus \$3 increase), \$10 for state, and \$22 for Ballwin-Chesterfield for a **grand total of \$94** which is \$3 more than last year's total. Fifty-nine dollars of the national dues will be tax deductible.

The AAUW year begins anew on July 1, 2021, thus your current membership expires on June 30. The preferred method to renew is online. B-C members received a personalized renewal email on the 16th of every month from March through June. Pat Shores asked that the email be sent from memberinfo@aauw.org. Open the message and click on "click here to renew." With one click, pay dues with your credit card. It's simple, safe, and efficient. The alternate method is to send your \$94 check to Pat Shores. Write your check to AAUW.

The finance officer and the membership vice presidents offered an early dues payment incentive which ends in June. The winning entry will be drawn at the Summer Picnic.

STEM

The 2021 Academy of Science St. Louis Science e-Fair was held the last week of April. Once again, AAUW Ballwin-Chesterfield sponsored awards and participated in the judging. Sandra Murdock and Jean Elliott evaluated 28 student science projects to arrive at their selection of winning entries.

Our branch recognized three young women for their well-designed experiments and impressive presentations. Kareena Kanumury, a tenth-grade student from Mary Institute and Saint Louis Country Day School (MICDS) Upper School, entered *Constructing Biodegradable Plastics from Everyday Materials*. Oviya Srihari, an eleventh-grade student at Ladue Horton Watkins High School, submitted *Predictors of Health Service Utilization Rates Among Patients with Eating Disorders: A Meta-analysis*. Madison Massmann, a twelfth grader at Cor Jesu Academy, presented *The Effects of Social Media on Body Shape Satisfaction in High School Girls*.

In addition to funding three MOST-529 scholarships to honor these awardees for their significant work, AAUW B-C sent a personal message of congratulations to each girl.

Joan was a master gardener who installed a water feature on her own. She also was a beekeeper who made lip balms from the honey, which she then gave as gifts. Public Policy

Thank you to outgoing Co-director Karen Francis for her many contributions to public policy and welcome to Ann Riley as the incoming Co-director of public policy for 2021–23. As the new year begins, the branch Public Policy Committee members will be meeting to align our 2021–22 strategies with the 2021–23 AAUW Public Policy Priorities that were recently supported by AAUW membership.

Key Missouri issues during the last legislative session included Medicaid expansion and voting bills. Funding for Medicaid expansion did not pass but a lawsuit seeking to force Missouri to expand Medicaid coverage under a voter-approved constitutional amendment will go to trial in Cole County on June 18. Voting rights bills did not come to a final vote before the close of Missouri's legislative session, but there is the possibility of a special session to be called to vote on these bills.

The United States Senate failed to advance the Paycheck Fairness Act. Voting rights bills are still active; contact your representatives in support of the *For the People Act* and the *John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act*. The U.S. Department of Education Office of Civil Rights held a virtual hearing on Title IX, June 7–11. AAUW provided public comment that emphasized the need to create regulations that uphold the commitment to ensuring equal and nondiscriminatory access to education for students at all educational levels and restore rules and guidance removed by Secretary DeVos.

Public Policy will be communicating to members through our branch website. We ask that you check out the Public Policy section often to keep abreast of issues and actions you can take to support AAUW's mission.

The fee includes admission to the aquarium, a visual train ride, and \$10 donation to Dollars for Scholars. There is a 20-person limit, so sign up early and wear your walking shoes. If you think the literal and proverbial train left St. Louis Union Station years ago, your mind may be changed by several thousand fish, a few otters and two blue lobsters. In the aquarium, you will be whisked away on a visual train ride, interact with marine animals in the six galleries, and at every station learn from the knowledgeable guides as you enjoy the underwater worlds of the Mississippi and Missouri Rivers and the deepest parts of the ocean.

Lunch will be on your own at the Union Station Soda Fountain, where the menu features the countertop classics you know and love with over-the-top twists. Be sure to save room for a creamy ice cream dessert-maybe a banana split. Parking is free with a coupon from the Soda Fountain. This tour will not include riding the St. Louis Wheel, which has an additional charge. 
