In Memoriam

Gloria Goetsch, a long time Ballwin-Chesterfield member, passed away peacefully at age 89 in January 2020. Because of the pandemic, her celebration of life was deferred. Gloria met her husband through the St. Louis Tip Toppers (he was 6'4" and she was 5' 11"). The Goetsch family moved to River Bend in 1963, where Gloria became an original member of the Sweet Adeline's River Blenders and participated in the local school community. She was active in AAUW, Wednesday Club, Repertory Theater Board, International Travel Club, and many others. Gloria had a lifelong love of acting and dancing. Her husband, Fred, passed away in April 2021, before Gloria's memorial could be held. The children and grandchildren plan a combined celebration for both Gloria and Fred this summer.

Jan Loudon was a smiling face to anyone who needed her. After she married Bob, the love of her life, together they raised four active boys. She was the mom who drove all the carpools and never missed any of the boys' games or practices. Once the boys were in school, she worked in sales for several years and then taught children with special needs in the St. Louis Public Schools. Jan was the quintessential beloved socialite who always wanted to be involved. In retirement, she volunteered for Meals on Wheels, Delta Gamma Foundation, Presbyterian Children's Home, her church, many political candidates, and AAUW. Even when declining health required her to stay home, Jan stayed involved by making telephone calls to check on others and by participating in Zoom committees.

Janet Ludwig was proud of being a registered nurse. She continued to keep up with classmates at St. John's School of Nursing. Skills learned there helped her take care of family medical needs, and even some of her AAUW friends, including helping Jan Loudon. Janet was an accomplished bridge player and enjoyed playing with friends. For many years, she was chair of branch interest group Bridge I. Janet chaired the Claymont Estates Stock Club in which B-C member Jean Wagner participated. During part of her life, Janet worked for the Board of Election as a supervisor. She was organized and kept up with all of the rules for the elections and took care of the other workers. Some could not do their job and Janet spent extra time helping them and did extra work to cover for their inabilities.

AAUW Fund New Study Explores Impact of COVID on Latinas

A new study by AAUW examines how Latinas in the US have suffered disproportionate repercussions of the COVID-19 pandemic and calls for targeted policy solutions to address their needs. This study is grounded in the real-life stories of Latina women based on interviews of more than 40 women who represent the diversity of the Latina population in the U.S.

The fact sheet gives a look at nearly 30 million Latinas with demographic information on educational levels, workforce rates, political engagement, access to health, economic status, and more. The study recommends policy changes that explore ways to recover from the COVID crisis and advocates specific policies for the nation's Latinas. This document outlines AAUW priorities and calls for immediate action.

AAUW Public Policy Priorities for 2021–23 were recently supported by AAUW membership and are now available for members at <u>https://www.aauw.org/resources/policy/aauw-public-policy-priorities/</u>. This year's changes were based on member leader feedback:

- Refine and add specificity regarding AAUW's commitment to addressing systemic racism.
- Refine our commitment to equitable access to higher education for all.
- Emphasize the importance of high-quality data collection.

The Biennial Action Priorities are:

- To support a strong system of public education that promotes gender fairness, equity, diversity, and inclusivity, and to address the barriers and implicit biases that hinder the advancement of women and girls.
- To achieve economic security for all women.
- To guarantee equality, individual rights, and social justice for a diverse and inclusive society.
