





AAUW has applauded the plan to reduce and/or forgive some student debt. However, Gloria L. Blackwell, AAUW CEO, points out that, "Student debt remains an obstacle to gender and racial equity. The administration must provide a permanent solution to canceling student debt and expand loan repayment options." Visit the national website, aauw.org to read her entire statement.

Along the same lines, AAUW is promoting passage of the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act, which requires employers to provide reasonable accommodations to pregnant workers. Examples of this idea would be assuring access to bathroom breaks and water bottles. You can support this act by using the two-minute activist available on the national website.

AAUW joined many other groups and strongly condemned the recent U.S. Supreme Court decision regarding reproductive freedom. In her official statement, Gloria L. Blackwell states, "Being able to choose whether and when to become a parent improves women's well-being and fosters economic security, which is a crucial component of AAUW's mission." On the local front, AAUW is closely tracking implementation of the new Missouri election laws. Many of our members are working to secure voting access, and some have even taken steps to become certified voter registrars. Access to voting is central to the AAUW mission. Public Policy

November 8 is Election Day in the US and the first time the new Missouri voting law will take effect. There are major changes that went into effect August 28, 2022, that you, your family, and friends need to know:

- You must show a nonexpired Missouri driver's license or non-driver state ID card, a nonexpired US
 passport, a nonexpired military ID including a veteran's ID card or another current Photo ID from the
 Missouri state or federal government to vote.
- Unless you are verified through the Secretary of State as a Voter Registration Solicitor, you cannot share voter registration information or absentee voter information with more than ten people.
- This law is curtailing the ability of organizations to assist voter registration.

To exercise your right to vote, you must be registered by October 12.

- 1. Make a plan to vote.
- 2. Check your registration status at sos.mo.gov/elections or call your local election authority.
- 3. Verify that you have the correct voter identification.
- 4. If you have any questions or concerns on election day, call the Election Protection hot line @1-866-our-vote.

AAUW Survey: Nearly Half of Women Feel Financially Insecure

In the wake of the pandemic, nearly a third of the women polled by AAUW reported that their income is not sufficient to meet their basic needs. Nearly half of those polled reported that they did not feel financially secure. The poll, conducted in August 2021, asked 723 women living in New York City how the pandemic affected their economic status. A significant portion said that they had lost some or all their income during the pandemic. Among those who did not report losing income, many were struggling to meet ends meets long before the pandemic.

AAUW advocates for women by calling for comprehensive unemployment insurance, paid leave for all and canceling crippling student debt to give millions of women and families the financial stability they need to thrive. Through AAUW Fund, our resources are used to take concrete steps toward ending the systemic inequities that are hurting women and their families. AAUW Fund fuels our efforts to keep AAUW a political powerhouse; the White House knows our name. We can and will make a positive and significant contribution to women's lives through our contribution to AAUW Fund.

Finance

The Ballwin-Chesterfield Branch 2022–23 proposed budget was approved by the board at its September meeting. The next step is for members to vote to approve the proposed budget at the October branch meeting. A copy of the proposed budget will be distributed to each member for review before the branch meeting. Contact Pat Shores with specific budget comments or questions **before** the October meeting. For your information, the branch has two bank accounts and one CD account of \$3070 approximately.

The Operating Fund Account is the biggest and most active fund. The income comes mainly from two sources: the \$22 portion of the dues that our branch retains and the winter fundraiser. Operating Fund expenses mainly include rental costs for the board and branch meetings at the Ballwin Golf Club Events Facility, Liability and Director and Officer insurance policies, an AAUW Greatest Needs Fund donation, IBC, NCCWSL and International Relations support, cash awards for high school girls planning STEM college studies, AAUW state conference attendance, and officer, director, and committee expenses. Check the Operating Fund portion of the proposed budget to see the many mission-based activities our branch supports.

The Dollars for Scholars Account income comes from the ten-dollar donation that the branch keeps. The expense in the DFS account is for the scholarships for four mature women returning to school and costs of an outing, if applicable.
