Greetings to all! As I write this, it is about 3 weeks until the next election. Although most AAUW members do not need reminders to vote, please take the time to encourage family and friends to make time for this critical task. If you or anyone you know needs assistance voting, try sos.mo.gov/elections, or call 1-888-our-vote.

AAUW has remained focused on equity for women and girls throughout the election season. The recent student debt cancellation is welcome, but it is unlikely to solve the economic stress many women face due to their unequal financial status. Women still earn substantially less than men, they hold nearly two-thirds of the outstanding student debt, and their pensions are limited due to their reduced earnings over a lifetime. What can be done? AAUW (aauw.org) suggests:

- Strong state and federal laws focused on ensuring equal pay for all American women.
- Employers need to commit to continuous improvement and to enacting policies and practices that will help put women on par with men.
- Women individually need to advocate for themselves: They need to negotiate for the best possible pay and benefits and pursue higher-paying jobs, promotions, and leadership opportunities.

AAUW will stay focused on these goals as well as other opportunities to help women and girls flourish. You can enjoy the coming fall season with family and friends and still participate in the AAUW mission. You can contribute to AAUW Greatest Needs Fund, join a club or committee, attend a meeting, or meet friends for pumpkin spiced latte. Whatever you choose, have fun!

Are You Ready for November 8?

The November 8 General Election is approaching quickly; are you ready? The passage of

H. B. 1878 has changed many aspects of voting in Missouri, from required forms of identification to how assistance in the voting process can be provided to voters.

Here is what you need to know with only a few days left until November 8:

- ✓ You must present a non-expired government issued photo ID to vote.
- ✓ If you do not have a valid ID, you can cast a provisional ballot. Your signature will be checked to determine validity or you can return with a valid ID before the polls close.
- ✓ No-excuse, in-person absentee voting at your Election Authority ends at 5 p.m. on November 7.
- ✓ Mailed absentee ballots must be received by your Election Authority by 5 p.m. on November 7.
- ✓ Mailed absentee ballots must be notarized unless you meet specific requirements.
- ✓ Free notarization is available at UPS and St. Louis County Libraries; no appointment required.

AAUW Extends Dues Renewal Date to November

Since members had issues renewing their dues through AAUW's Community Hub, AAUW will extend the grace period for renewing AAUW memberships through November 30, 2022. This means that members who were slated to lose their AAUW membership June 30, 2002, now have until November 30 to renew while retaining their June 30 expiration date. AAUW Fund

AAUW Executive Director Gloria Blackwell issued a statement on September 13, 2022, in response to figures released by the U.S. Census Bureau. Among the findings were:

Comparing full-time year-round workers, women took home 83.7 percent of the pay men did.

Including part-time and seasonal workers, women were paid 77 percent of men's wages.

Black women were compensated 64 percent and Latinas 54 percent of what white, non-Hispanic men were paid.

In coalitions with other equity organizations, AAUW has the goal to attain a fuller sense of what women are paid in the workforce. AAUW remains committed to advocating for laws and policies that remedy the burden on women. Your contributions to AAUW Fund ensure that this important work continues.



Virginia Minor Honored with Historical Roadside Marker

The National Votes for Women Trail, a project of the National Collaborative for Women's History Sites, has collaborated with the William G. Pomeroy Foundation to install historical roadside markers in every state to commemorate events and leaders of the women's suffrage movement.

AAUW, League of Women Voters members, and other interested parties attended the dedication of the marker commemorating the work of Women's Suffrage leader Virginia Minor on October 15, 2022. The marker was installed at the site of a previous home, currently occupied by Provident Counseling, 2652 Olive Blvd, Louis, Missouri.

Minor was the 1867 founding president of the Woman Suffrage Association of Missouri. Her attempt to register to vote

was rejected, and on October 15, 1872, she sued. The case reached the United States Supreme Court which ruled:

Neither the Constitution nor the fourteenth amendment made all citizens voters ... a provision in a state constitution which confines the right of voting to "male citizens of the United States," is no violation of the Federal Constitution. In such a state women have no right to vote.

The court's decision in *Minor v.*Happersett led to a shift in strategy by suffragists to focus efforts on obtaining women's suffrage through a constitutional amendment.
