

Minutes of the AAUW-BC Branch meeting, 11-10-2022

Jean Light, Finance Officer, reported the balances for Operating Fund - \$28,224.32, and Dollars for Scholars - \$4,853.42.

Marian Bauer, Public Policy Co-President, reported that PP worked all this first quarter on Get Out the Vote.
