- National AAUW notifies us when our voice is most needed.
- 2. It only takes two minutes.
- 3. Go to <u>aauw.org</u> and type Two-Minute-Activist in the search bar.
- 4. Click on Two-Minute-Activist sign up.
- 5. Fill out Contact Information.
- 6. Check Remember Me to get Fast Action.
- 7. Click Submit.
- 8. Respond right away to national requests, which are time sensitive.
