

### **Legal Advocacy Fund**

#### Sex discrimination takes a variety of forms

Created in 1981, AAUW's Legal Advocacy Fund has provided millions of dollars to balance the scales of justice for people working toward gender equity through the legal system. The fund supports brave plaintiffs seeking legal redress for equal pay, Title IX, *Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964*, and tenure denial violations.

- Legal Advocacy Fund Legal Case Support Grants are available to fund cases in state or federal court that address sex discrimination in employment or education and have the potential to set or reinforce precedent for future cases on gender discrimination.
- The application period for funding of \$5,000– \$20,000 is August 1 through November 15.
- Unfair pay, pregnancy discrimination, sexual harassment, sexual assault, and violations of Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 can affect both women and men.

#### John Doe v. Jane Doe

Jane was a college student who reported sexual misconduct by a fellow student to her school. The college conducted a formal Title IX investigation process and hearing, and ultimately found the Respondent responsible for sexual misconduct in violation of its Title IX policy and removed him from the college. The Respondent brought a defamation suit against Jane, which is still pending in court. Case Adopted January 2023.

- Labor Day marks the unofficial start of the run up to the November 2024 presidential election.
- The ERA is celebrating its 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year with 85 percent of Americans across gender and party lines supporting the passage of this amendment. Congress continues to work to finally ratify the ERA.
- Ending the gender pay gap and creating gender equity in education will also be front and foremost in AAUW's work this year.


## **Finance Officer Report**
