Member Dues Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

The dues cycle opened on April 1. Please watch your email Inbox for notifications from national AAUW reminding you to renew your membership.

What are our dues for 2025-26? \$106 - This amount reflects an increase of \$2 toward your national membership. The AAUW Board's decision to increase dues allows the national office to cover more costs of member support and help offset increased costs due to inflation.

When should I pay my dues? Most Ballwin-Chesterfield members have an expiration date of June 30. Members who have joined since July 1, 2022, will renew on their anniversary dates (i.e., 12 months from the date of joining). If you are unsure when your dues expired or will expire, you can always contact the Membership chairs, Susie Teicher or April Walgren.

How do I access the online renewal process?

- 1. Go to aauw.org.
- 2. Click on Log In in the upper right corner. The "Welcome" page displays.
- 3. Enter your email address and your password. If you have not chosen a password, go to Forgot your password? which is located below the Log In box and follow the prompts.
